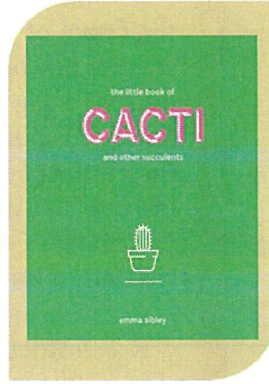
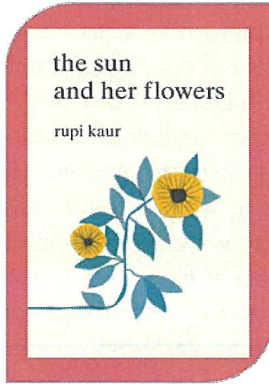
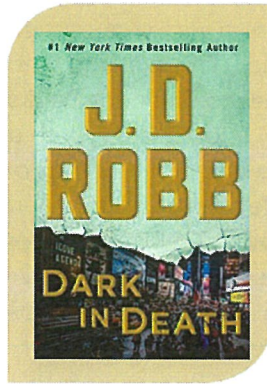
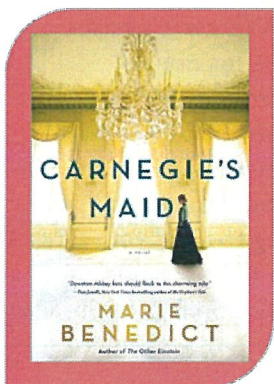
## Make-it, Take-It Mason Jar Craft (Adult)

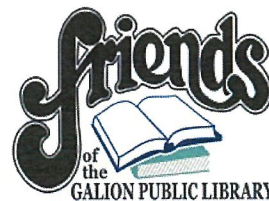

## Director's Note

*THANK YOU! VERY MUCH!!*

Over the years, donations have gone down. I don't believe it has anything to do so much with the Library, as with cultural and economic changes. People just don't have the money to give anymore. But there are still surprises. 2017 was a life saving year for the Library thanks to the generosity of two very special women.

Last year, the Library made the tough decision to build a much needed storage facility. It was a tough decision because it was a major hit to our Building Fund. The fund is what maintains this beautiful Carnegie building. We were sad to hear of the passing of Laurie Rhodebeck the year before, but we were incredibly surprised to find out that she had left us a major donation. A donation large enough to pay for the construction of our storage center! We were further surprised when a second bequeath from Laurie arrived that was as much as the first! Our Building Fund is sitting much better now and this gift will help us to keep our Carnegie building in repair for a long time. In late March we are planning a Dedication Ceremony for the Building including a plaque to commemorate her gift.

Not long after receiving Laurie's final gift, we received another bequeath from the estate of Martha Jean Stewart. It was also a very generous gift. We were pleased to see this one because of our Enrichment Fund. This is a fund that pays for our programming at the Library from Story Times to Bingo for Books. Support for the fund has always been from individual donations. Unfortunately, with donations down, our Enrichment Fund is also going down with no sign of future improvement. Thanks to Martha Jean Stewart, we are going to be able to put a sizable donation into our Enrichment Fund so we can continue to provide quality programming to all of you. This has been a fairly recent gift so we are still discussing what we can do to honor her.

We are so thankful for these generous women who felt the Galion Public Library was an institution that was worthy of their support and love.
