

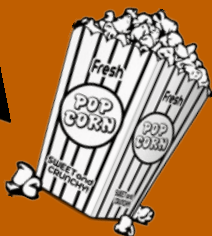
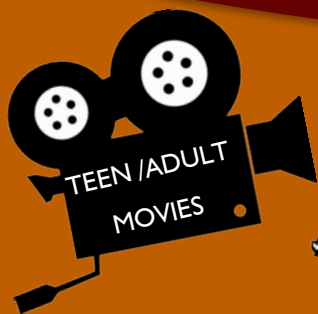

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This past August, I had the great opportunity of attending part of the IFLA (International Federation of Library Associations) Conference. For 82 years, this organization has met once a year to discuss the state of librarianship on a global scale. Only 5 times have they met in the U.S. and this year, they met in Columbus, Ohio. Thanks to the generosity of our Board and Friends of the Library, I was able to attend three days of the week long conference. Over 4,000 librarians attended from over 140 countries. With surprise, I realized that all of us are concerned about the same things; how technology is rapidly changing library service, how to make our libraries more secure and what services to offer our patrons. I heard a woman from Taiwan talk about programming in their library. After surveying all the libraries in Taiwan, the top three requested programs were BookStart (same as our Story Time), cooking programs and crafts. These are the same three requests we receive here as well. A librarian from Qatar talked in excited tones about the new National Library facility they are building. A gentleman from Sarawak (part of Malaysia) was telling me that every child born in Sarawak receives a book bundle containing books for children and information on how libraries can help their family. They have proof now that this programming is improving the education of the children even those in rural areas. The program is so popular that all of Malaysia may adopt it. Book Bundles for newborns are also a popular service in many libraries in the U.S. My favorite moment though was on the bus ride back from the reception. I got in a lively discussion, not library related at all, with those around me who included three women across from me who were from South Africa, Ethiopia, and Bhutan and an Italian gentleman sitting beside me. This whole experience made me realize that we are indeed part of one world.
