DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Checking out books at the Library is not just a function but is often a social event. "Hi, how are you? The kids have sure grown! Yes, that book was really good." The process usually involves a little chat about something current. Recently, the big topic everyone talks about is the weather. "60 degrees in December! Wow, -12 wind chill is cold. Let's hope the snow stays away." This got me to thinking about Ohio weather. There's a great book, , by Dr. Thomas Schmidlin, that describes some of the major weather events in Ohio. Most of us can easily remember the 2005 ice storm. I can still remember the dead silence punctuated with the crack of the trees breaking. In July 1992, we broke the records for the most tornadoes in Ohio in one day (28). Those of us who are a bit older remember the great blizzard of January 28, 1977. The next day was my birthday and I spent it huddling in a dorm room with no heat. My parents remembered the 1965 Palm Sunday tornadoes. There was a little town near where I grew up that was hit. The local joke was that "Rockaway Blew Away". Your grandparents may remember the heat wave of 1934. Gallipolis reported the record high temperature of 113 degrees that still stands. In March of 1907, 4-6 inches of rain per hour fell on the lower part of the state for two days. The Ohio River rose 30 feet at Marietta and displaced over 5,000 people. One of the earliest and strangest phenomenon was in 1882 when the coast of Lake Erie near Cleveland was hit by a giant 8 foot wave. Locals noticed a huge thunderstorm over the lake right beforehand. 




