## **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

The State Budget continues to work through the system. The Governor released his budget in January and now it has worked its way through the House of Representatives. The Governor and the House both agreed on lowering the percentage that public libraries receive from 1.7% of the General Fund to 1.66%. It doesn't sound like much of a decrease but that 0.04% breaks down to a loss of millions of dollars to the public libraries. On top of that, all the taxes coming in haven't been as high as expected. As a result, we are seeing a drop in funding due to the economic situation as well as the percentage decrease. For the last five years, the Galion Public Library has been struggling. We are maintaining the library on what we receive but have no money for extra services. Our new storage building was built from money we were saving to maintain the building, but only after we discussed all other possibilities. When we replaced the windows a few years ago, there was one window upstairs that cost \$20,000 alone. It's not an easy job to run a Library. We would like to do more. I would like to see our microfilm turned into a digital form. We've been talking about creating a special Job Finding area dedicated to helping people find jobs. I would like to see online classes offered through our website. There's so much we could be doing, but just can't. The State Budget is going to the Senate next and then to a Joint House/Senate Committee. Please think about writing a letter to Senator Dave Burke and telling him how much your library means to you. Senators love to hear our stories. Tell them why the Library is important to you. Senator Burke's address is Senate Building, I Capitol Square, Ground Floor, Columbus, OH 43215 (614) 466-8049. We have time yet to save our funding.
